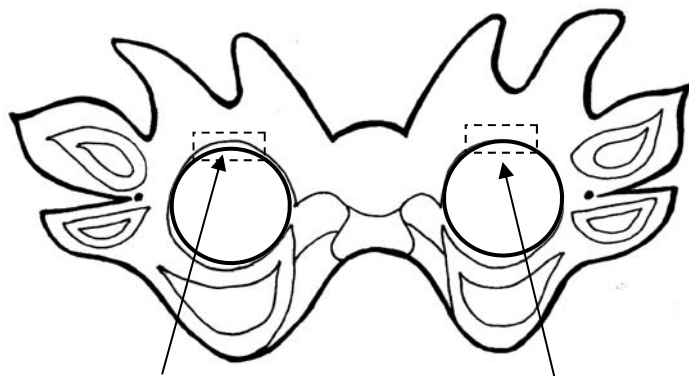
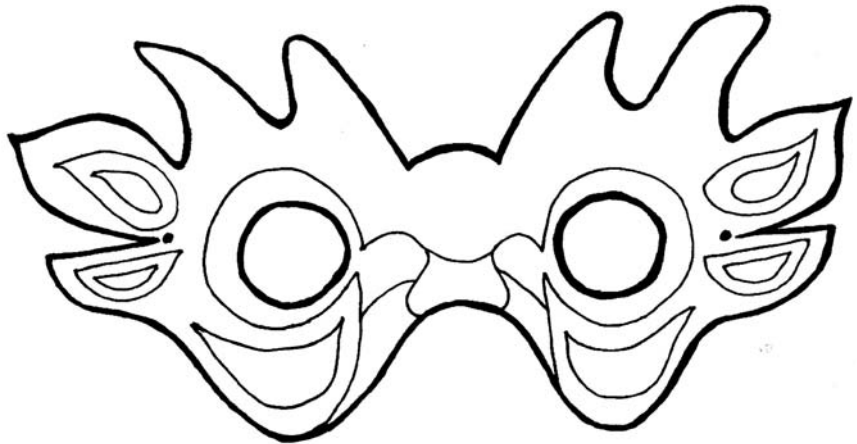
New Sight Specs

You will need:

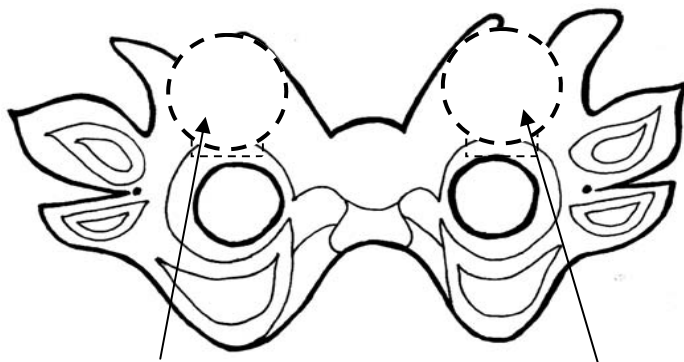
- ♦ photocopied glasses pattern
- ♦ light-weight cardboard
- ♦ coloured felt pens, including silver and gold
- ♦ feathers and other decorative notions
- ♦ scissors, glue, sticky tape
- ♦ hat elastic
- ♦ *Optional:* Blutac

Preparation:

- ♦ Photocopy the glasses and lens covers onto light-weight card. (See next page)



Sticky tape lens covers over the eye holes.



Lens cover flaps lift up so children can see.

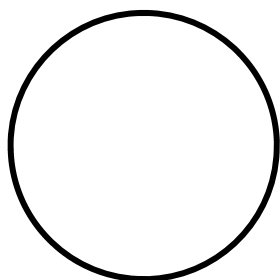
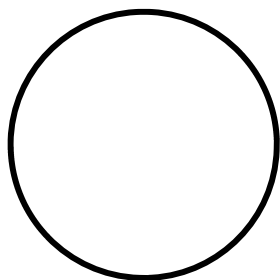
What to do:

- ♦ Children can colour in the specs as they wish.
- ♦ Cut around bold lines, including the inside of the glasses eye-holes.
- ♦ Decorate as desired with extra bits & pieces.
- ♦ Cut out the two lens covers. Colour or decorate as desired.
- ♦ Tape one over each eye hole so the lens covers cover the holes but can be lifted up (like a flap).
- ♦ Attach some hat elastic through the black dots at the sides, to fit the child's head.
- ♦ If you wish, attach a small amount of Blutac to the eyebrow area so the lens covers can stay up when pressed onto the Blutac.

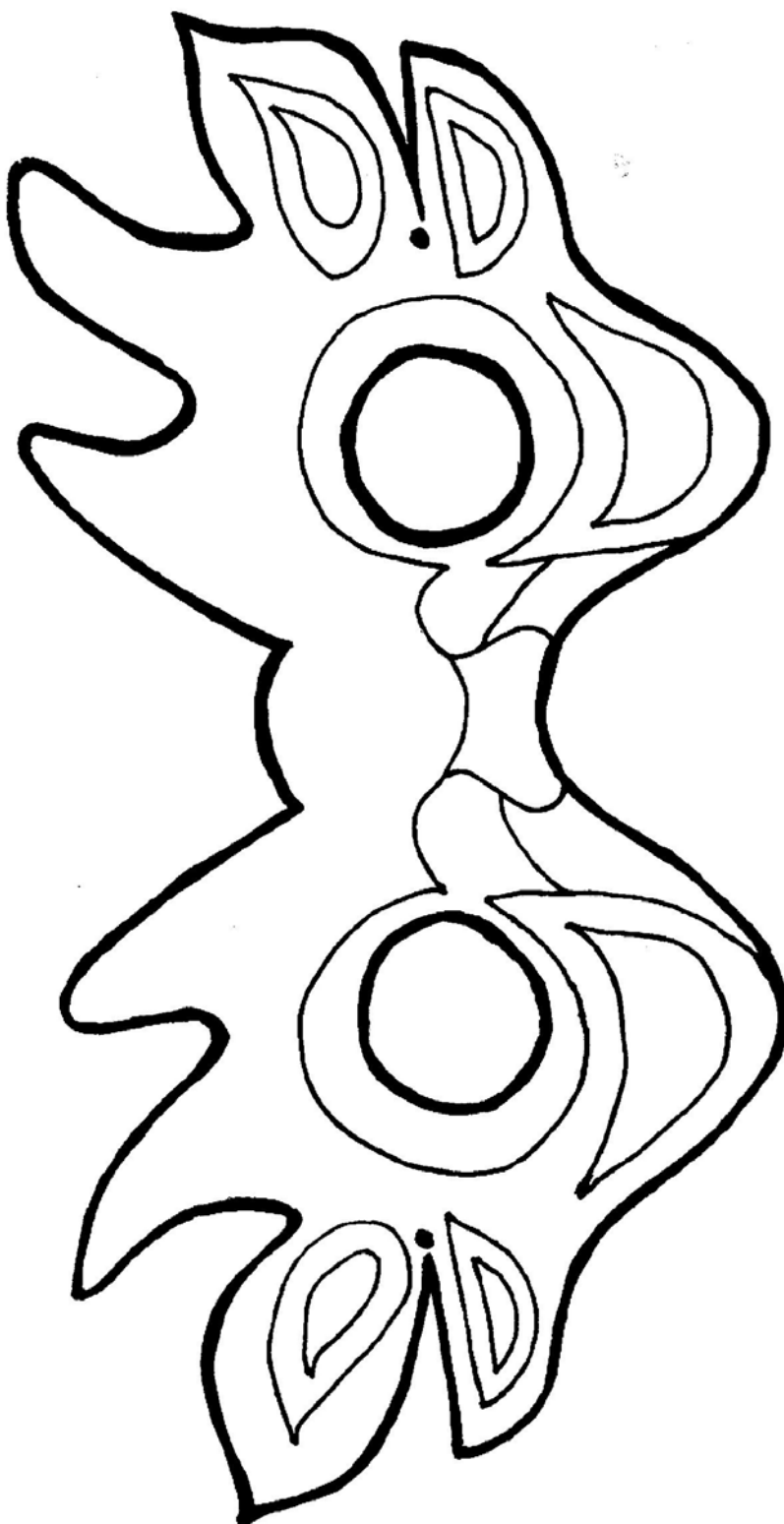
