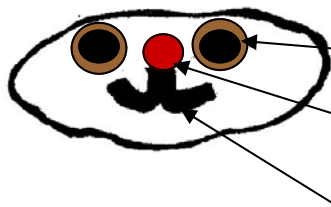


## Jesus, the Good Shepherd

### Good Shepherd Cupcakes

#### Materials:

- ♦ prepared cupcakes
- ♦ mini marshmallows
- ♦ white icing
- ♦ thin liquorice strips, choc melts, sultanas, red M&Ms
- ♦ plastic knives



Chocolate melts for eyes and/ or sultanas

Red M&M or Smartie for nose

Bits of liquorice strip for mouth

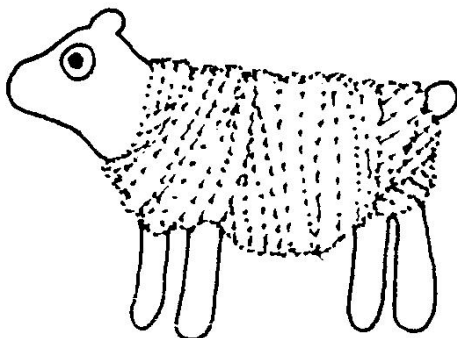
#### What to do:

Give each child a cupcake and a plastic knife each, and instruct them to do the following:

- ♦ Spread white icing on the cupcake.
- ♦ Create eyes, nose and a mouth on the cupcake using thin strips of liquorice and/or chocolate bits, sultanas and M&Ms.
- ♦ Cut the mini marshmallows in half (or smaller) and add them around the cupcake to make it look like a sheep.
- ♦ Enjoy!

### Woolly Sheep Brooches

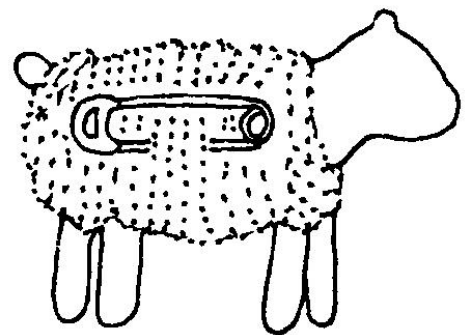


#### You will need:

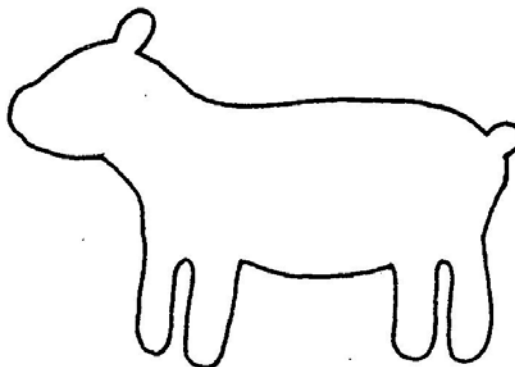
- ♦ ice-cream container lids (white)
- ♦ sheep shape
- ♦ scissors
- ♦ wool
- ♦ small safety pins
- ♦ goggle eyes
- ♦ craft glue

#### What to do:

- ♦ Trace around the sheep shape onto an ice-cream lid. Cut it out. Have the plain white side of the lid as the front.
- ♦ Wrap wool around the sheep many times to make the sheep look 'woolly'.
- ♦ Near the end, place the open safety pin on the back of the sheep and continue wrapping the sheep ten more times to hold the safety pin on.



- ♦ Tie the end of the wool to the safety pin, slip the loose end under the nearest strands of wool and put a dab of glue on the end of the wool to secure it.
- ♦ Glue a goggle eye onto the front of the sheep.
