Win-Win Cards (Respect)

Jesus tells people to resolve disputes with respect. Use this card game to make patterns that remind children that their rights end when the next person's rights start, and vice versa – it's a mutual thing, the art of negotiation and compromise in the best interests of both (Win-Win).

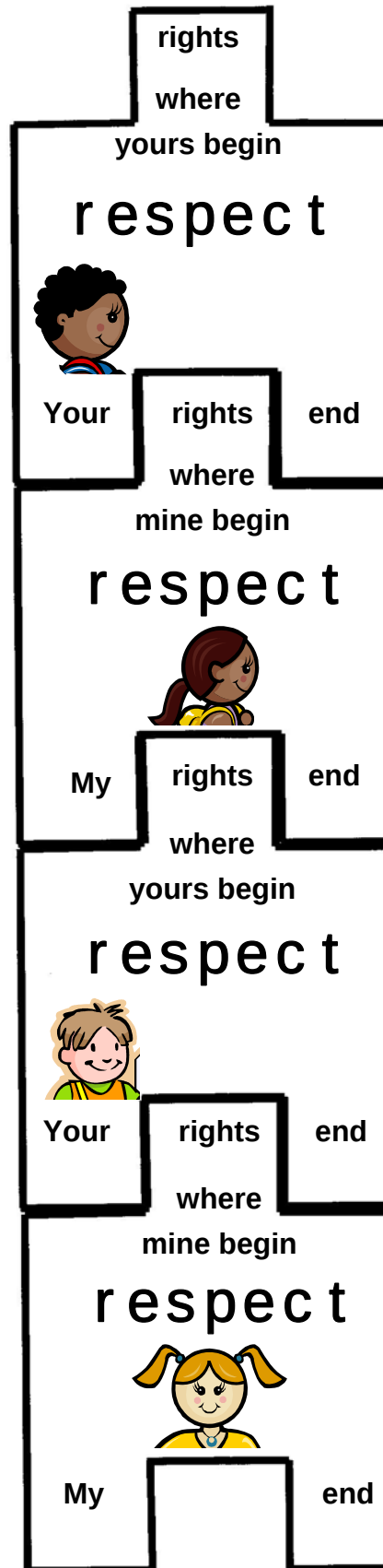
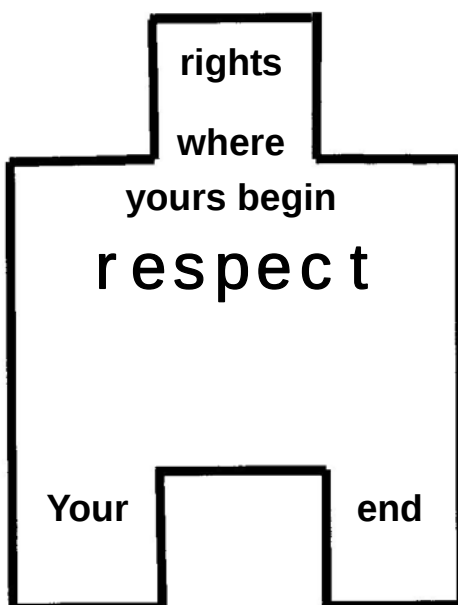
You will need:

- a variety of coloured cardboard
- pictures of people's faces: if you are really clever and organised you might be able to get photos, heads only, of your children and other people in your church/school/community; otherwise, cut faces out of brochures and sales catalogues
- scissors
- glue
- masking tape

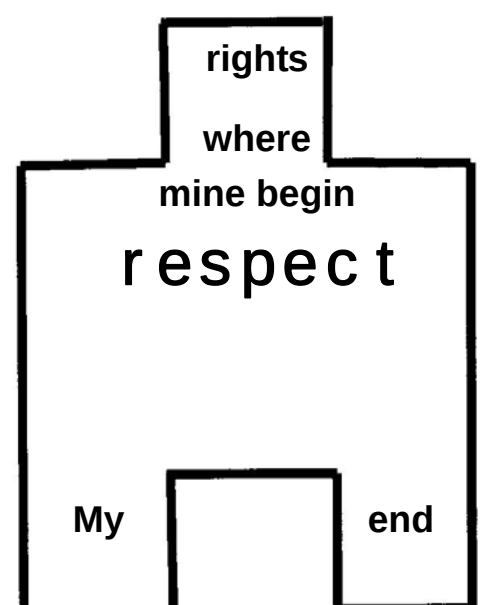
Preparation:

Prepare templates of the tessellating shape (Icecream container lids are excellent for templates)

What to do:

- Photocopy the template onto a variety of different coloured card-board.
- Children can cut out 6-8 each.
- Cut out faces and glue one into the middle of each shape.
- The children can then take turns to fit the cards together one at a time in a long line. As they put one down they read the words from where their card connects to the previous one. If it has a picture of a person they know they can say that person's name: e.g. 'Where my rights end, Sean, your rights begin.'

Alternative:

- Photocopy smaller shapes, and the children can make a bracelet to go round their wrist:
- When the cards are completed connect enough to go around the child's wrist
- Lay them face down still connected
- Press a long piece of masking tape over the middle of the back of the whole line.
- Make one end of the tape longer than the end of the cards, form a circle and join up the circle with the overlapping piece of masking tape

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
