

## Handkerchief Shirt

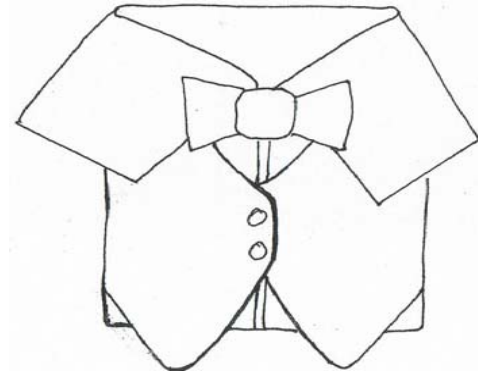
### You will need:

- ♦ men's hankies
- ♦ pins
- ♦ cardboard vests (*see pattern*)

### What to:

- ♦ Fold hanky so that it looks like a shirt (*see diagram and instructions*)
- ♦ Photocopy vests onto coloured card.
- ♦ Cut around outline of vest.
- ♦ Fit vest onto shirt front and pin in place.
- ♦ Attach a tag: "To Dad with love"

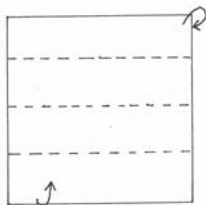


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### Handkerchief Shirt Instructions:

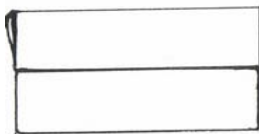
- ♦ Lay hanky out flat on table.
- ♦ Fold the top ¼ of the hanky over to the back to meet the horizontal centre line.
- ♦ Fold the bottom ¼ of the hanky upwards to the front centre line.

Fold top 1/4 to back ▼



▲ Fold bottom 1/4 to front

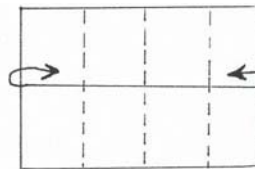
Top folded to back ►



Bottom folded to front ▲

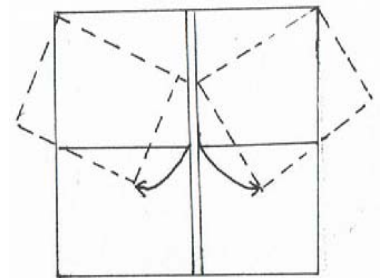
- ♦ With previous folds intact, fold the sides to the middle to meet at centre front.

Fold left side into centre front ►



◀ Fold right side into centre front

- ♦ Take the corners of the 'collar' and pull down and out onto a slant.



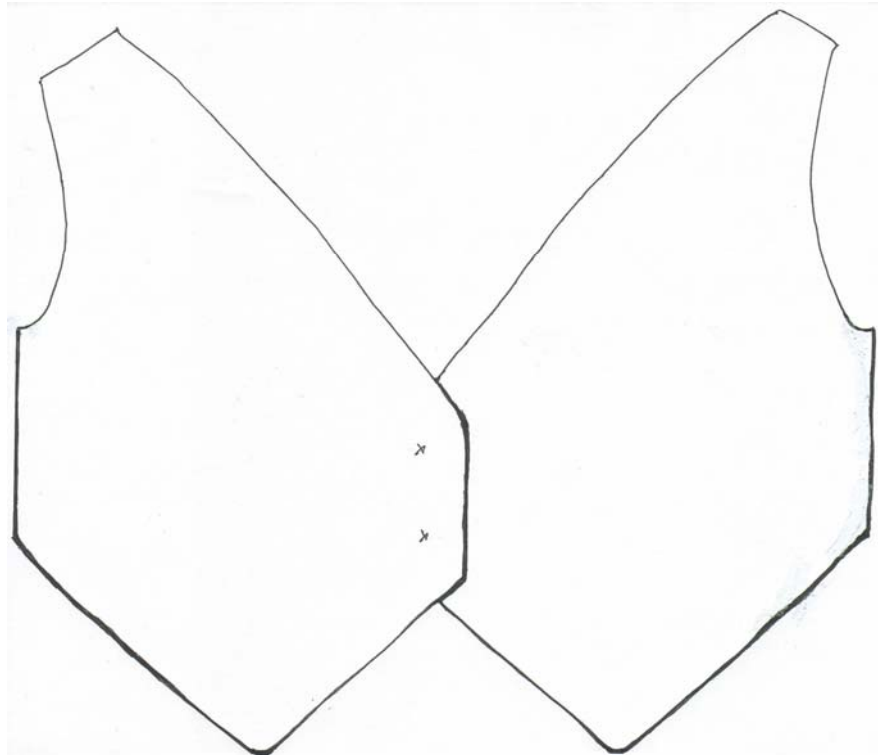
- ♦ **Vest:** *see photocopyable pattern next page*
- ♦ Glue buttons or coloured (gold?) stickers on x x
- ♦ Add vest to 'shirt' and pin in place under collar.
- ♦ *Optional:* add a bow tie
- ♦ Attach a tag: "Happy Father's Day, Dad"

## Handkerchief Shirt

### Vest pattern for Handkerchief shirt:

Enlarge to measure 20cm  
across ('side seam' to  
'side seam') and 17.5 cm  
from top RH shoulder to  
level with bottom right  
hand V.

X marks position for  
buttons or coloured  
circles



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
