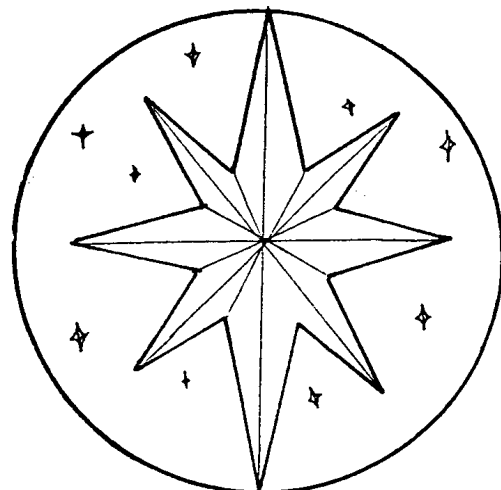
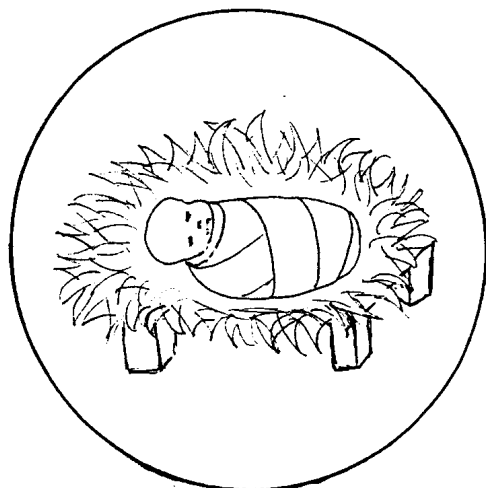


You can use these pictures in a variety of ways:

- Colour them in, paste onto coloured cardboard or into the lids of coffee jars, add a ribbon for hanging and hang on the tree.
- You can also photocopy them onto cardboard, colour them, then press them inside a plastic ring from a peanut butter jar. Cover the ring first by winding curling ribbon round and round it. Tie the hanging ribbon in place before you put the picture in. Make sure you

photocopy the pictures the right size to be a snug fit inside the rings.

- Photocopy them onto white paper, colour in with bright colours (textas work best, but pencils and crayons also work) and then brush with cooking oil (baby oil also works but is more expensive). The oil makes them translucent when held up to the light, so they make great "stained glass" type window decorations. **WARNING:** They do leave a mess when you peel them off the windows later on, but it comes off with a good detergent and elbow grease.
