ROADMAP TO RE-OPEN CHURCHES

THIS ROADMAP REFLECTS THE SA GOVERNMENT'S STEPS AND IS CONTINGENT UPON THE MOVEMENT THROUGH THOSE STAGES. **CHURCHES ARE ADVISED TO TAKE A CAUTIOUS APPROACH TO REOPENING AND ONLY TO PROCEED WHEN ALL ASPECTS ARE CONSIDERED.**



Stay home if you have cold or flu symptoms






Wash hands and sanitise often



Vulnerable people* to talk to their doctor about what is appropriate for them

STEP 2 PLUS: (From 19 June)

STEP 3: (From 29 June)

  A revised version of your **Government of SA COVID-Safe Plan**  showing the new maximum patrons per room should be sent to you. A new plan is only required if the total amount of space or number of rooms originally submitted will increase (\$5000 fine applies).

- **300 max** on whole site: that is 4 rooms with 75 max per room
- 1 person per 4 sqm
- 1.5 metres physical distancing
- Record of attendance and contact details to be kept for all activities

- **All details/ dates are to be confirmed depending on State Government advice when released**
- No max limit, but 1 person per 4 sqm rule per room
- 1.5 metres physical distancing
- Record of attendance kept

Allowed, up to 75 max in one room
Up to Congregation to decide
Strict guidelines**
Postpone except special circumstances
Online, one in service collection point
75 max within govt guidelines

Church events (for e.g. camps)
Hospitality / food service

Further clarification being sought

Personal hygiene

Hand sanitiser at door, common areas

Cleaning

Cleaning required between each use 

Multiple events (on the same day)

Cleaning required between each use

Further details of Step 3 will be provided as they are released by the government

* Vulnerable people are those over 70 years old, those over 60 with a chronic health condition, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people over 50 years old with a chronic medical condition, and people with compromised immune systems. Synod Crisis Management Team (CMT) encourage church councils to carefully assess all vulnerable persons particularly in forward facing volunteer roles during these early steps.

** Individual cups and bread pieces/ wafers; gloves to be worn by those preparing, congregation members to use hand sanitiser before receiving Holy Communion

*** No sharing of food or beverages using shared/self/serve utensils.
