Mark 1:29-39

As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew.

Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they immediately told Jesus about her. So he went to her, took her hand and helped her up. The fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening after sunset the people brought to Jesus all the sick and demonpossessed. The whole town gathered at the door, and Jesus healed many who had various diseases. He also drove out many demons, but he would not let the demons



speak because they knew who he was.

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark. Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. Simon and his companions went to look for him. and when they found thev exclaimed: him. "Everyone is lookina for you!" Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else-to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come "

So he travelled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons. New International Version

In this Scripture story, Jesus uses his hands to help Simon's mother in law, to heal, to pray. As soon as Simon's mother in law was healed, she used her hands to serve. Restored to wholeness, she waited on Jesus

with gratitude. We each use our hands in various ways to heal and help and pray and serve. As Christ loves us and brings us to

wholeness, so we are to show others love, healing and grace; and when we fold our hands in prayer, when we care for our neighbour, when we visit someone who is not well or cook for a family in need, we are being Christ's hands in the world.
