## Record of Service – Rev Casey Lau (Deacon)

Casey was born in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in 1948, finished his primary and secondary education at the Methodist Boys' School in Kuala Lumpur in 1968. In 1969, he was admitted as a member of The Honourable Society of Lincoln's Inn to read law and was called to the Bar of England and Wales and the degree of Barrister-at-Law in the Trinity term of 1972. Casey returned to Kuala Lumpur in 1972 and was called to the Bar in the High Court of Malaysia in 1973 and in 1994 was admitted as a Barrister and Solicitor in the Supreme Court of South Australia. Casey gained a Graduate Diploma in Business Administration from UniSA in 1994. Casey commenced his working life in Australia in various capacities with several banks, legal firms and the Economic Development Authority, Government of South Australia in Adelaide.

Casey migrated to Australia with his family, settled in Adelaide in 1987. He found faith in Christ late in life at the age of 35 years. After moving from Adelaide to Goolwa, he sensed an overwhelming call to ministry and commenced studies at Tabor College, Adelaide in 2006 and graduated with a Bachelor of Ministry in 2009. Casey records his ministry as follows,

Casey was ordained as Deacon in the Uniting Church on 13<sup>th</sup> November 2014 at Adelaide West Uniting Church. His ministry in the Fleurieu Peninsula included involvement in charitable and non-charitable institutions on the Peninsula.

Casey resides in Middleton, South Australia with his wife, Pit Cheen and has two children, daughter Jade married to Gary residing in Perth, WA and son, Wyman who resides in Adelaide.
